





#### 28. Erotic Cane

Ca. 1880-Substantial ivory handle "His" on the front and "Her" on the back, finely chased gilt collar with engraved initials, malacca shaft and a metal ferrule. Well used classic cane in jumbo size and with an age grown patina. H. 5" x 1 ¾", O.L. 35 ½" \$1,500-\$2,000

#### 29. Ivory Erotic Cane

Circa 1890-Very unique ivory ball knob plain on one side and carved in low relief with an erotic motif on the other. Turned ivory collar and a well figured Congo wood shaft with a metal ferrule. Suggest feminine intimate parts. H. 2 ½" x 2", O.L. 33"





#### 30. Ivory Cat Head Cane

Ca. 1890-Substantial ivory knob naturalistically carved to depict a cat head with long whiskers and bowtie, finely chased and gilt metal collar with engraved initials "C.I.W.", ebony shaft and a metal ferrule. This cane strikes the essence of cat portraiture and brings up the feline personality in a lovable way. 

A flawless, smooth and sun bleached surface with an adequate delicate patina surely adds to its appeal and lends the handle an irresistible, tactile sensuality. #### 36. Ivory Seal Cane

Birmingham hallmarks, Ca. 1890-Large single piece ivory handle fashioned in a basic T-shape and naturalistically carved to depict a sleek-bodied seal and with short and wide flat flipper limbs. Ebony shaft with a brass ferrule and a wide silver collar with engraved scrolls and the "A.G.K." initials above an apparently later added presentation date "1925". H. 4 1/4" x 3", O.L. 36 3/4" \$1,400-\$1,800

#### 37. Ivory Nude Cane

Ca. 1870 - Very large ivory L-shaped handle with a standing beauty at the front, flush set silver initials "WL" at the back, ebony shaft and an ivory ferrule. Way out of the ordinary in the size and quality and in superb condition. The great artistry demonstrated here is underscored by the satin texture of the ivory and its flawless, smooth and light bleached surface which also lends this feat of feminine beauty an irresistible, tactile sensuality. #### 38. Ivory Elephant Cane

Ca. 1880-Large ivory handle carved to depict a prone elephant. Finely chased silver collar, dark rosewood shaft and a stag horn ferrule. The cane is emphasized by an eye catching small ivory rat with down hanging tail applied in two parts against each other to give the impression that it goes through the dark wood. #### 40. Erotic Ivory Cane

Ca. 1890-Large ivory crook handle with a naked couple in an erotic embrace. Very daring for its day, the well-aged handle comes on a malacca shaft with a plain turned ivory ring collar and a metal ferrule. H. 4 1/2" x 3 ½", O.L. 35 ¼" \$2,000-\$3,000

#### 41. Ivory Pierrot Cane

19th Century-Ivory handle fashioned of the tip of an elephant tusk and carved to depict a Pierrot head. Much of that mythic quality of the clown adheres to this very portrait with a compelling smile, frilled collaret and oversized, outlandish conical bonnet. Malacca shaft with a plain silver collar with obscured London hallmarks and a stag horn ferrule. Quality cane, very fine carving and superb patina. H. 6 ¾" x 1 ¾", O.L. 36 ¾" \$1,500-\$2,000

#### 42. Figural Ivory Day Cane

Ca. 1920-Ivory handle fashioned of a single piece in a basic Opera shape on a rosewood shaft with a stag horn ferrule and silver collar with obscured London hallmarks. ### 43. Anglo-Colonial Souvenir Cane

Dated January 1st, 1896-Substantial ivory handle carved on the top and in high relief "Souvenir Mayumba J.W.C.Africa January 1st, 1896" and decorated on the sides with etched leaves. Malacca shaft with a white metal collar and a metal ferrule. H. 4 ½" x 1 ½", O.L. 35 ½" \$600-\$900

#### 44. Ivory Dog Head Cane

Ca. 1900-Well carved greyhound head in a beautifully stylized L-shape and longer muzzle with strong teeth and a pair of inset glass eyes. Dark rosewood shaft with a stag horn ferrule, silver collar engraved "GLATZL" with Austo-Hungarian hallmarks. Intact. H. 4" x 1 ¼", O.L. 37 ¾" \$800-\$1,000

### 45. Ivory Revival French Cane

Ca. 1890-Straight ivory handle carved in the Middle Age style with two portraits against one another. The young girl and young man are rendered in high relief and painstaking fine detail and framed by very rich and elaborate decorative elements. The handle, possibly symbolizing marriage, comes on an ebony shaft with a stag horn ferrule. H. 3 ¼" x 1 ¼", O.L. 38 ¼"

### 46. Ivory Turf Cane

19th Century-Stretching urn shaped ivory handle with a horse head in a horse shoe within two beaded friezes, matching silver collar with obscured London hallmarks, dark rosewood shaft and a stag horn ferrule. H. 4 ½" x 1 ¼", O.L. 36 ¾"

#### 47. Ivory Rats Cane

Ca. 1890-T-shaped Opera ivory handle carved in deep relief with rats, oak leaves and acorns. While the panels are different on each side, the rodents are naturalistically rendered with pointed snouts, long tails and the amusing bat ears. Furthermore, they are enlivened by inset glass eyes. #### 48. Ivory and Ebony Dress Cane

#### 49. Marine Cane

Ca. 1850-Walrus ivory pistol shaped handle on a substantial, one piece baleen shaft with a metal ferrule. The plain and slightly tapering shaft itself shows the specific layered structure of the noble material of the ocean and its dark color with coveted brown-greenish hues. ### 50. American Wild West

19th Century-Ebony and ivory handle inspired by a revolver grip, hardwood shaft with a metal collar and missing ferrule. Rarely encountered cane with few dents in keeping with the age and the merits of a well-used surface. H. 5 1/4" x 3 3/4", O.L. 37 3/4"

#### 51. Ivory Cats Cane

Chester 1897-Straight walrus ivory handle carved with three cats in a cleft with jagged edges, finely engraved silver collar with Chester hallmarks 1897, ebony shaft and a metal ferrule. Charm is the trademark of this cane which was probably inspired by the drawings of Louis Wain, and the passage of time it had endured adds to its magic. H. 4  $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 1  $\frac{1}{2}$ ", O.L. 34  $\frac{3}{4}$ "

#### 52. Ivory Cat Head Cane

Birmingham hallmarks 1892-Well carved cat head in the taste of Louis Wain with two large eyes and a pair of upwards extending, prominent ears marked by a long and bushy fur. Malacca shaft with a long stag horn ferrule and embellished with silver collar engraved by hand and monogrammed in the late Victorian opulence of its day. H. 3 ¼" x 2 ¼", O.L. 34 ¼" \$800-\$1,200





#### 53. Ivory Owl Cane

Ca. 1900-Ivory knob carved to depict an owl holding a writing feather in its paw and perched on a paper scroll, richly colored and well streaked rosewood haft with a long stag horn ferrule. The micro carved bird shows fine detail and is presented on a turned ivory base with a hexagonal center part. H. 1 3/4" x 1", O.L. 37 3/4" \$500-\$700

#### 54. Memento Mori Skulls Cane

Ca. 1900-Straight stag horn handle carved with human skulls piled over one another, a symbolic reminder of the inevitability of death, malacca shaft with a plain white metal collar and iron ferrule. H. 4 ½" x 1 ¼", O.L. 35 ¾"

#### 55. Ivory Chrysanthemums Cane

Ca. 1890-Long and straight ivory handle carved in low relief with a flower composition dominated by large chrysanthemum buds and irises, ebony shaft and an ivory ferrule. First rate work of art. H. 8 ½" x ¾", O.L. 39" \$700-\$900

#### 56. Dieppe Ivory Badine

19th Century-Long ivory handle delicately carved in high relief with, what seems to be, an allegory of the summer. One can see wheat spikes, flying birds and flower garlands among other decorative elements. Rosewood shaft with an ivory ferrule. H. 5 3/4" x 1 ½", O.L. 36 ½" \$500-\$700

#### 57. Revival Ivory Cane

Ca. 1910-Ivory Pharaoh bust on a longer knobbed stem with ebony dot inlay on an ebony shaft with a horn ferrule. Anglo-Egyptian cane from the Revival period and contemporary to the great excavations discoveries of early 1900s. H. 6 ¾" x 1 ¼", O.L. 37 ¼" \$700-\$900

#### 58. Ivory Thanksgiving **Mascot Cane**

Ca. 1890-Rounded ivory knob with an encircling ring of various fruits and vegetables and a four leafed clover, well dressed Malacca shaft and an ivory ferrule. Excellent quality and great condition. H. 2 1/4" x 2", O.L. 37 1/4" \$700-\$900

#### 59. Ivory and Ebony Art **Deco Dress Cane**

Ca. 1895-Carved ebony handle with two full nudes on a large ivory plinth collar, ebony shaft and a 2 ¼" ivory ferrule. Directly linked to the rich and distinctive heritage of the Wiener Werkstätte, this cane is Viennese Art Deco. H. 3 1/2" x 1 1/2", OL. 38 1/4" \$400-\$600

#### 60. Ivory Cat Cane

Ca. 1900-Ivory pistol-grip handle carved with a cat portrait, well veined rosewood shaft with a silver collar and a stag horn ferrule. Rarely encountered in the widespread cane repertoire this cane radiates a delightful feline charm. H. 2 ½" x 2", O.L. 37 ¼" \$700-\$900

#### 61. Noh Masks Ivory Cane

Ca. 1890-Japanese export ivory handle carved with four rows of Noh Masks accoladed to one another in various sizes and with different expressions. Ebony shaft with a plain silver collar and a missing ferrule. Rarely seen in such a large size and with similar fine detail. H.  $3 \frac{3}{4}$ " x  $1 \frac{1}{4}$ ", O.L. 38"


19th Century-Ivory knob fashioned in the stylized shape suggesting the leg of a woman with bent knee, garter and stockings, malacca shaft with ivory eyelets and braided dark silk loop with tassel and an ivory ferrule. The front of the knob is carved in low relief with a discreet panel, showing a sex panel with a woman involved with two men on a trefoil. It is thought to have a French origin.-H. 2 ¾" x 2 ¼", O.L. 37 ½"

#### 63. Figural Marine Cane

Ca. 1880-Sperm killer whale tooth carved with a seaman portrait, faux sprig hardwood shaft with metal eyelets and a metal ferrule. Reputed to have a Russian origin, this cane came with an interesting story that lends it a unique identity: It was supposedly made of a salvaged ship rudder broken by the bite of an aggressive whale which left the incisor hanging in the wood. The sailor who repaired the boat portrayed himself on front of the incisor handle, the boat on the back and made the shaft of the rudder wood. Ca. 1890-Ivory handle carved to depict a humanized dog dressed as a gentleman with a formal suit and riding cap. Ebony shaft with a wide silver gilt collar with obscured hallmarks and a horn ferrule. It has character and personality, is possibly French and well conserved only with a secured crack to the visor of the cap. H. 2 ¾" x 2", O.L. 39 ¼"

#### 66. Abraham Lincoln Ivory Cane

Ca. 1875-A nice presidential collectable, ivory handle, inscribed "Made from a rail split 1830 by Abe Lincoln-President 1865" is hand engraved on the silver metal collar, American oak hardwood shaft and an iron ferrule. I competed years ago in an auction and was the under bidder on this cane. H. 15/8" x 15/8", O.L. 36"



### 67. Scrimshaw Inlaid Whalebone Cane

Mid 19th Century-The photos speak for this cane. "Best of the Best" tortoise, baleen, shell, abalone and mother of pearl inlay, hearts and diamonds and various other symmetrical items inlaid, whale's tooth handle, 2/3 hexagonal shaft with a scalloped end, round bottom shaft and never had a ferrule. #### 68. Architectural **Scrimshaw Whalebone** Cane

Mid 19th Century-A prime example of this genre with a spiral column carved within the exposed whalebone beams, baleen diamond and dot inlay, three small baleen inlays atop, carved stacked disc whalebone handle which is one piece and no ferrule. H. 3 ¾" x 1 ¼", O.L. 35", D. of shaft 1" \$6,000-\$8,000

#### 69. Scrimshaw Whalebone Nautical Cane

Mid 19th Century-A carved whales tooth hand and baton handle with a fluted collar, wrapped baleen grip atop the partially fluted whalebone shaft, 4" tightly baleen collar below the grip with a nautical weave center and woven ends, never had a ferrule. H. 2" x 2", O.L. 36"

#### 70. Ivory Pique Cane

Ca. 1690-A fine example of an original silver pique cane which has been worked throughout, carved ivory eyelets which are outlined in silver, great original patina, coin silver collar, thick malacca shaft and a 3 ½" iron ferrule. H. 1 5/8" x 3 ¼", O.L. 33 ¾"


